

Transfer Funds For 10 Mile Sewer Arm

FARMINGTON Township has transferred portions of its sewer funds to pay for sanitary sewers constructed for Springbrook subdivision and planned for Staman Acres and Farmington Hills.

The township board Monday night voted to transfer \$560,000 from the township's interceptor fund to the 10 Mile sewer arm project.

THE LOAN WILL be paid back to the interceptor fund

from tap-ins collected from Springbrook and from Staman Acres and Farmington Hills when construction is completed in the latter two subdivisions.

Clerk Floyd Cairns reports that petitions are now being circulated in Staman Acres and Farmington Hills for sanitary sewers.

The loan can be repaid to the interceptor fund, Cairns says, because Springbrook tap-in collections will total about \$160,000 and the other two subs will pay another \$160,000 for tap-in charges. In addition, tap-in charges will be paid by the commercial properties along Orchard Lake, Cairns adds.

Recently completed work, which will be paid for by the \$360,000, is extension of the 10 Mile Arm from Middle Belt north to Dohoney Dr.

TREASURER Thomas Nolan reported an arrangement is being worked out for residents of Springbrook to receive rebates because the project bid was much lower than estimated cost.

Springbrook residents were assessed according to the engineer estimates and now
