## Harris Gets Oakland Post

Fred Harris, a Farmington resident who was an unsuccessful Democrat candidate for U.S. representative last year, has been appointed to the three-man Oakland County Road Commission to serve a six-year term.

Harris, 40, is president of Local 58, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, AFL-CIO. His annual salary on the recently designated part-time, policy-making board, up to \$7,500. He replaces Sol Lomerson, who retired Jan. 1.

Harris, married and the

father of three children, will be the lowest paid member of the board until terms of its other two members expire. The Oakland County Board of Commissioners recently authorized the cut from \$13,500 for the newly appointed member.

Harris is a graduate of Michigan State University and Wayne State University, is a former assistant prosecuting attorney for Wayne County and retired from the Wayne County Board of Supervisors.

Oakland County Commissioners referred a House Bill, providing for three-year staggered terms for the office of road commissioner, to the aviation and transportation committee.

Commissioners are considering supporting the bill to shorten the present six-year term because "a shorter term of office would make the appointed commissioners more responsive to the needs and desires of the people of Oakland County."
