

The stronger the light the bushier your beans, the weaker it is, the taller they grow. Cut off the top of the spectrum by filtering out the blue light and all the rays above it and even bush beans will show a tendency to twine. These are, in rough outline, the results of the experiments of Prof. H. W. Popp of Pennsylvania State college. Professor Popp did a large part of his work at the Boyce Thompson institute at Yonkers, N. Y., using the elaborate light-controlling apparatus there. He planted soy beans in separate compartments, and gave them light of graded intensity, ranging from over 4,000 candles down to 26. In all his plants, growth in length was greater under the moderately weak lights, though not under the weakest ones, and the latent tendency of the stalks to twine developed in the same sets.
