Regular meeting of the Commission of the City of Farmington held March 15.

Called to order by Mayor Butterfield.

Commissioners present: Hogle, Johnson, Hatton and Cook.

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

Bill of Clyde Adams for \$5.60 was read. Moved by Hogle, supported by Johnson that the bill be allowed. Carried.

The street committee recommended that the Commission purchase a street sweeper.

Moved by Hatton, supported by Cook that the report of the committee be adopted and the Commissioners authorize the purchase of a street sweeper. Carried all yeas.

Moved by Hatton, supported by Hogle that the recommendation of the Mayor in regard to sewers be adopted and incorporated in the official record. Carried all yeas.

It was as follows: That action be taken by the Commission to provide for securing and recording the locations, depths and sizes of all sewers and public drains within the city limits.

Moved by Johnson, supported by Hatton that G. H. Riddle be employed as Civil Engineer. Carried all yeas.

E. O. Hatton as secretary of the Charter Commission reported that two copies of the City Charter had been filed with the Secretary of State and two copies with the Clerk of Oakland County.

Moved by Cook, supported by Hatton that in the matter of the oil station in process of construction by William Walters, be referred to the street and sidewalk committee. Carried all yeas.

REGISTRATION NOTICE
To the Qualified Electors of the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland, State of Michigan:

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with Act 126, Public Acts of 1917 as amended, I, the undersigned Township Clerk, will upon any day except Sunday and a legal holiday or the day of any regular or special election or official primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter in said Township not already registered who may apply to me personally for such registration, or who may make application for registration by mail or messenger, as provided by Act 7, Public Acts of 1919, as amended, except that I can receive no

names for registration during the time intervening between the second Saturday before any general or special election or official primary election and the day of such election.

March 27, 1926, Last Day for General Registration by Personal Application for Said Election.

March 10, 1926, last day for registration by affidavit. See below.

Notice is hereby given that I will be at Schroeder's Market, in the City of Farmington, on March 13 and March 20, 1926 from 8 o'clock a. m. until 8 o'clock p. m. on each said day for the purpose of reviewing the registration and registering such of the qualified electors in said township as shall properly apply therefor.

The name of no person but an actual resident of the precinct at the time of registration, and entitled under the constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

Registration by Mail or Messenger.

Under Act 7, Public Acts of 1919, as amended, the privilege of absent voters is extended to include registration. They can also register by mail or messenger whether absent or not but the affidavit must be received by the Clerk on or before the 10th day preceding the third Saturday before the election.

Registration of Absentee by Oath

If any person whose name is not registered shall offer and claim the right to vote at any election, and shall, under oath, state that he or she is a resident of such precinct and has resided in the township twenty days next preceding such election, designating particularly the place of his or her residence and that he or she possesses the other qualifications of an elector under the constitution; and that owing to the sickness or bodily infirmity of himself or herself or some member of his or her family, or owing to his or her absence from the township on public business or his or her own private business, and without intent to avoid or delay his or her registration, he or she was unable to make applica-

tion for registration on the last day provided by law for the registration of electors preceding such election, then the name of such person shall be registered, and he or she shall then be permitted to vote at such election.

THREE If such application shall in said matter, willfully make any false statement, he or she shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and upon conviction, be subject to the pains and penalties thereof.

Provision in Case of Removal to Another Precinct.

Any registered and qualified voter who has removed from one election precinct of a township of the same township shall have the right, on any day previous to election day, on application to the Township Clerk, to have his or her name transferred from the registration book of the precinct from which he or she has removed to the registration book of the precinct in which he or she then resides. Such elector shall have the right to have such transfer made on election day by obtaining from the board of inspectors of election of the precinct from which he or she has removed a certificate of transfer and presenting the said certificate to the board of election inspectors of the precinct in which he or she then resides.
