Festivities Prolonged

at Macedonian Wedding

In any Macedonian's life the greatest days is his, or her, wedding day. Recently I was privileged to assist at the marriage of a peasant girl with the son of the local baker, writes a correspondent of the Chicago Daily News. The ceremony was performed in church and afterward all the guests adjourned to the house of the bride. To the accompaniment of weird music, not unlike that of the Scotch bagpipes, the bridal pair were welcomed on the threshold by their parents, who offered them bread and salt in token of lasting health and prosperity. Inside, the men and women were in different rooms. The men were offered wine and brandy and the women given jam. The married pair sat in a room apart, surrounded by their nearest relatives. Singing and dancing were indulged in. It is considered an affront to leave before daybreak. Next day the whole party, mounted on horses or riding in carts, escorted the bride and bridegroom to the latter's home. There the same proceedings were reenacted and the bride's trousseau was exhibited. It consisted of richly embroidered linen and it is easy to understand that it represents the savings and labor of many years. Despite the length of time that the festivities continued and despite the amount of wine consumed, nobody appeared to be at all the worse for drink.

A FEW NOTES ON HONEY

Honey is a natural sweet, that is produced by the bees principally the Italian, or the mixed Italians. Many believe, that when honey granulates or turns to a sugar form, that it is not pure. This is not so, for every year the United States bee inspectors set aside quantities of honey, and if it granulates, they know it is pure, but if it does not granulate, then is the danger. The pure laws have to be obeyed.

Comb honey has many different flavors, many think that it is manufactured. Each variety of flower produces a different kind of honey. There has been, for the last twenty-five years, a standing offer of \$1000 to anyone who manufactures one comb of honey. This is being offered by one of the largest bee supply companies in the United States, and means it.

One can prove it by himself that it has not been accomplished by comping any number of combs. No two will be the same. If manufactured, there would be many combs the same.

By a few experiments at home, with my sister as a partner, I find that a desert spoon of honey added to a medium sized pan of fudge will relieve one of the worst of having it turn to sugar. The same is true with boiled icing making it creamy and rich. Honey used in making cookies will make them remain fresh much longer than those made without it. Frederick Sheill.
