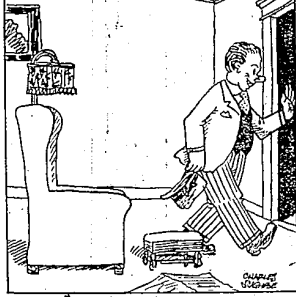
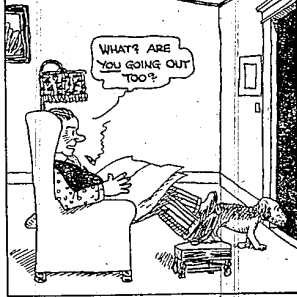
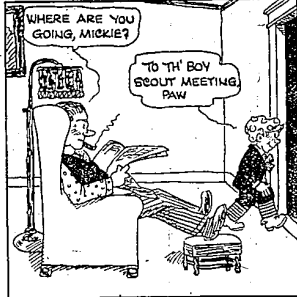

Beacon for Airmen
 The first flashing aviators' beacon to be erected in this country has recently been installed on the top of the twenty-two-story building of the Atlantic Refining company of Philadelphia. The beacon is of powerful capacity and will aid aviators between New York and Washington, a route that has proved hazardous due to the early darkness along the coast in fall and winter. The beacon will be equipped with a flashing apparatus similar to that used in lighthouses and will be visible for twenty to thirty miles.

New Angle to Old Yarn

One story that never grows old is the purchase of Manhattan island from the Indians for \$24 worth of trinkets. This transaction is usually thought of as concerning this side of the water exclusively. But a dispatch from Wesel, Germany, gives it an interesting new angle. Wesel claims as a native son Peter Minuit, the first governor of the New Netherlands and the purchaser of the island. Not unnaturally, Wesel regards itself as having a right to celebrate the three hundredth anniversary of the historic incident. And so the city fathers of Wesel send greetings to New York and also name one of their chief streets after Minuit. It is a gratification which this city appreciates.—New York Post.

Complain of Damage Done by Woodpeckers

Woodpeckers are worrying the good people of the East, remarks the Milwaukee Journal. At Hindsville, N. Y., the Methodist church has sought a federal permit to kill the birds which have been pecking chunks off the roof and spire of the church.

The pastor and the trustees have appealed to the state conservation commission, which advised them to shoot the birds and "give them decent burial under the law which required proper interment of all wild life thus killed." But the state permit was not sufficient as the United States biological survey governs the woodpecker tribe. The approval is coming from Washington.

Canadian woodpeckers invaded the Tacoma Lakes (Maine) district and attacked the telegraph, telephone and trolley wire poles in that vicinity. In some instances the birds drilled holes through poles and also pecked the braces in two, which resulted in the poles toppling over. The poles brought the wires to the ground, interrupting service.

Manchuria Outlet for Activities of Japan

Physically, Manchuria is an irregular inverted triangle, covering 382,637 square miles, with its base in the north along the Amur river, which separates it from Siberia, and its southern apex where Port Arthur thrusts into the Yellow sea.

Peopled at the dawn of history by the virile Tungus of the Mongol Tartar blood, a race of hunters, herdsmen and warriors from whom are springing the Japanese and Koreans of today, the land has been flooded by waves of immigration from China and has been the scene of countless battles, notably those of Japan against the Chinese and the Russians. Always it has been rich in forests, grain and coal. Centuries ago it was called the granary of Asia. Today it is serving the cause of peace by providing a vast field for Japanese activities as well as food for the Japanese people.—W. O. Inglis in the North American Review.

Volcanoes Put to Use

In Italy and in some of the volcanic islands of the Pacific the steam power issuing from volcanoes has been harnessed for engineering purposes. The people of the Tuscan town of Lardello light their streets, heat their homes and do their cooking by means of volcanic steam pressure, which generates enough heat to cook a joint in less than half an hour. In another district in Italy volcanic energy is exploited for the purpose of making electricity, which is supplied to many towns, some of them more than 50 miles distant.
