Traces Locomotive Design

The history of the locomotive building industry can be traced by the exhibits of the Baldwin Locomotive works in the palace of transportation at the Sesqui-centennial International exposition, now being held in Philadelphia. The exhibit includes an engine built by Mathias Baldwin in 1830, the "Big Mogul," a locomotive weighing 75 tons, which was awarded a prize at the Centennial exposition 50 years ago, and a modern freight engine, which weighs 350 tons.

A Garage Peril

Tests made by the United States public health service to determine the danger involved in a closed space show that a small 23-horse power engine discharges 1 1/2 cubic feet of carbon monoxide in a minute, or enough to contaminate the air of a closed garage, 10 by 20 feet, to the danger point in about three minutes. Carbon monoxide gas has no color or taste, and can be present in deadly amount without being perceptible.

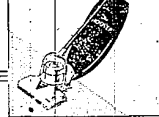

The deepest telephone in the world was installed recently at the bottom of Tamarack shaft No. 5 of Calumet & Hecla Consolidated, at Calumet, Mich., says the Engineering and Mining Journal-Press. The vertical shaft is 5,300 feet deep. The connecting cable weighs almost four tons. It is anchored to shaft timbers with fastenings that support the weight and prevent the line from sagging or breaking.
