Career Plan Depends On Girl's Education

The Women's Liberation Movement may not have hit your town with all the bombast it has had in large metropolitan areas, but we bet there are rumblings to be heard wherever the girls meet.

But just demanding equal

rights and equal pay is not the entire answer to this problem. An important part of the disparity lies in women's education attainments, and in the goals and aspirations acquired when they were children.

Most girls have a romantic image of life—school, marriage, a family, and a happy life ever after. But in reality, modern women work, too; some 59 per cent of the 30.5 million women in the labor force are married.

ANALYSIS of the data shows that a high proportion of women are employed in their early working years. Then there is a marked decrease during child-bearing years; followed by a progressive increase in job employment in each age category afterward up to the age of 35.

or 60. The two periods women are most likely to work are during the ages of 20 to 24 and 45 to 54.

IN THE FUTURE, the number of working women will increase with more equality in jobs and pay. Also, the life expectancy of women is constantly rising.

A girl born in 1967 has a life expectancy of 74 years. If she marries young and has children before age 30, she still will have 30 to 35 years of active life before her.

These are but a few of the important reasons why little girls must grow up planning on a career and with realistic goals. Their talents should be permitted to develop to the optimum. If college is not possible, there are good careers in many fields such as health and data processing.

Or why not become an apprentice—a carpenter or a lady plumber, like "Cluny Brown," if that's your bent? The entire world of work is being opened to qualified women.

Freeway Lights Will Be Replaced

Bids will be taken in June to replace approximately 200 damaged or broken light poles on Detroit freeways, the Department of State Highways announced in Lansing.

Some of the poles have been damaged and out of service for several months. All are expected to be back in operation by August.

Repairing and replacing damaged freeway light poles usually is done by the utility company furnishing the power for light. The utility bills the Highway Department for the work.

Because the Public Lighting Commission of the City of Detroit has inadequate manpower to replace the poles, the Highway Department will assume the work.

The department tries to collect from the party responsible for the damage. Cost of poles and lights ranges from \$600 to \$1,200 each, depending on the type and location.

FEA Backs New Cabinet

FARMINGTON — A nation-wide drive by the National Education Association aimed at establishing a federal cabinet-level post for education has been endorsed by the Farmington Education Association.

"The NEA proposal to consolidate the many fragmented federal education programs under a separate cabinet for education would provide both President Nixon and Congress a better understanding of local school district problems," says Robert Neuhauser, FEA President. "What's more, it would help provide additional federal funds for education."

The NEA has called for a massive "letter writing" campaign by teachers urging President Nixon to immediately establish a cabinet Department of Education. The campaign will climax between March 29 to April 6.

Knifing Takes Brown's Life

A Southfield businessman and Farmington Township resident was buried Sunday, April 4, after succumbing from stabbing wounds received in Detroit last month.

Larry Brown, 22, of 32380 Olde Franklin Dr., Farmington Township, was stabbed in Detroit, March 17 near Calvert and Woodward Aves.

HE WAS taken to William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, treated and released, and then re-admitted later when taken ill again.

It was discovered Brown had a punctured heart and he died in Beaumont on April 3.

Oakland County medical examiners report cause of death as being a stab wound to the chest. Detroit homicide division is still investigating the incident.
