

Livonia Council Delays Kmart Plans

LIVONIA — against the city which ended in the invalidation of the city's apartment "moratorium."

The developers' original plans for the site called for a shopping center, apartment complex and light manufacturing zone. Approval was granted for commercial zoning for the shopping center, but the manufacturing zone was deleted.

JEROME L. SCHOSTAK, a Southfield developer, has been before the council several times asking for site plan approval for the store. The land is zoned commercial, so council approval of the site plan would allow the beginning of construction.

The council stalled action on the site plan last month when Schostak suggested a row of small specialty shops be built along with the Kmart store. However, construction of the small shops would require a change in zoning, so the council decided to delay action on Kmart plans until further consideration could be given to the smaller shops.

Schostak and others involved in the development of the Seven Mile-Farmington Rd. site filed a lawsuit

Apartment plans for the site were delayed by a city ordinance which prohibited construction of apartments within 1,000 feet of a single family residence area. The ordinance in effect ended apartment construction in the city.

However, a Wayne County Circuit judge ruled that the ordinance was passed illegally and invalidated it. The city has appealed the ruling.

Series Tickets On Sale For New Power Center

ANN ARBOR — An exciting array of musical and dance attractions, including dance companies from Canada, Africa and Greece, has been scheduled for the inaugural year of the new Power Center for the Performing Arts at the University of Michigan.

The new building, now in the final stages of construction on the campus, is a gift of the Eugene B. Power family. The attractions are part of a series, called "Choice Series."

There will be 10 events offered beginning Friday, Oct. 15 with a performance by Marcel Marceau, famous French pantomimist.

CONCERT-GOERS will have an opportunity to select any four or eight of the 10 attractions at special series prices. Three of these programs will offer second preference.

Choice series subscriptions go on sale April 15, and all will be filled in the order received. Single events, not sold out, will be put on sale in September.

"After 10 years of presenting attractions on the inadequate stage dimensions of Hill Auditorium, we are happy to have this new modern stage house at the university to enable us to expand our format of annual presentations," said Gail Rector, president of the society.

The Power Center for the Performing Arts is located by Pelch Park, Huron and Fletcher streets, on the U-M campus.

Total capacity is 1429 seats, 965 at orchestra level and 455 in the balcony. No seat is more than 72 feet from the stage.

FOLLOWING MARCEAU's appearance in the new center, the next attraction will be the Sierra Leone Dance Company, performing for the first time in Ann Arbor Oct. 30.

Ballet comes again on Nov. 10 with the popular Canadian company, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet.

An unusual musical group, the Swingle Singers from Paris, made popular by their foreign tours and recordings of classical and jazz improvisations, will make their local debut Nov. 19.

Following closely, on Nov. 20 and 21, a special "festival pair" of programs will be

given by Chorica, a modern dance theater company from Athens. Choreography, music and speech are combined in adaptations from the ancient Greek dance dramas, comedies and tragedies. This will be their first American tour.

THANKSGIVING weekend will see a special treat for young balletomanes when the National Ballet of Washington, D.C., stages a full-length production of "Cinderella." This is set for Nov. 27. The new Power Center stage with ample dimensions makes this possible.

On Jan. 17 the Paris Chamber Orchestra, led by Paul Kuentz and featuring soloists Adolf Scherbaum, trumpet, and Barbara Schick, organ, will give the first of two concerts. The second, Jan. 19, will include a chorus from the U-M Choral Union.

Two very different kinds of recitals follow. A Handed program will be sung Feb. 17 by the leading baritone from Munich opera, Herman Prey.

On March 1, the guitar and lute will provide a special test for acoustics in the new hall as they are performed by Julian Bream of London.

The Choice Series will close on April 16 with the New York Pro Musica's colorful and authentic production of a medieval court masque "An Entertainment for Elizabeth."
