



### HOW TO FIRES

A carelessly left campfire-a carelessly thrown match or spark-may mean acres of timber destroyed in a few hours. Only decades of slow growth will replace the loss.

Pine forests eatch fire easily. Many travelers from states where there are no forests, or only hardwood forests, do not realize that our northern woods, composed largely of highly inflam-mable pine, will burn so easily. The underlying bed of leaves and dry pine needles acts like tinder in carrying fire from a spark dropped in it. Fires creep underneath this forest floor and appear in distant places
