Bureau To Survey 6-12 Homes

Six to 12 Farmington homes will be surveyed by the Census Bureau the week of Oct. 14 to determine how many Farmington children and adults under 5 are enrolled either in school or college.

Questions are asked of households at this time each year to update national figures on enrollment in public, private and parochial schools; full and part time college attendance; the number of high school graduates and dropouts; and the last year of regular schooling for non-high school graduates.

The survey will be taken simultaneously throughout the United States from a representative sample of the nation's households. All answers are confidential and the information obtained will be used for statistical purposes only.
