An old reader of the Enterprise who feels a friendly interest in the original prose and poetry contributed by the local literary geniuses, desires to express his appreciation, and incidentally broach a proposition which he hopes will meet with editorial favor.

He thinks that Miss Walling has made a fairly commendable beginning in the poetical field. She has talent that is not unpromising. She has a natural facility for rhythm that is capable of discipline and development. Give her a sound knowledge of the technique of verse, and the practice of the masters, and the experience in life, and she might succeed in comparing not unfavorably with Anne Campbell or Edgar A. Guest. Miss Walling might be interested in The Principles of English Versification by P. F. Baum, and The Art of Verification by J. Berg Eisenwein. Of the two books, the latter is the more simple and readable.

We read the first of Judge Schulte's promised series of essays, but have failed to find a continuation of them in subsequent issues of the Enterprise. We hope that the revival of letters which came in—(note the co-incidence)—with the springtime, will last longer than the charms of that fleeting season. We do not want our young writers to expire during the dog days of summer. Is not this an appropriate moment for a critic to step in and stimulate the activity of their pens? How can literature flourish in this day and age with so many officious, busy-body to comment and criticize, to excite public interest and cultivate the public taste?
