"It's part of their activities to share, discover and learn," Michel Yasso said.

We have a dog at home. It (the dalmation) is squealing. I think that's what scared her," said Ashley's mom, Lisa Lalinsky.

Three-year-old Joshua Gordon found a firefighter all dressed up in firefighting equipment, complete with air tanks, that captivated him. "He always says he's going to be a fireman. I'm going to save people," his mom, Sheila Gordon said, of her son.

While the kids were busy, parents

had an opportunity to see the new fire truck that was just delivered to the department. Actually it's a pumper that carries water and comes complete with equipment compartments.

But what makes this pumper different is that it's one of the new breed of trucks that has enclosed compartments for firefighters to ride in so they can't fall off as has happened in other communities when firefighters hang onto the sides of the truck.
