HOW INDUSTRY supports Baden Wartemberg's "hauptachule" was the eye-opener. In this six-year vocational system, for ages 10 to 16, German students spend 314 days in class.

The company pays them salaries and their social insurances, provides tools and instructors — 68 percent of the total cost, Barth sald.

Local industries in this southern state are Mercedes-Benz and Porsche, the automakers, and many computer manufacturers — much like southeastern Michigan.

Barth said, "Successful trainees become journeyment, they can become masters, techniclass, instructors. The world is open to them." Germany's first astronaut studied plumbing in a Baden Wurtemberghauptschule before advancing to university physics, she said.

Companies themselves decide whether to take part in the dual system. They training more than they can employ "ahe said." Training is of increasing importance for the commic success of companies.

With the tearing down of European economic barriers, as said, a hauptschule graduate can work in France or any other country of choice. Hauptschule students must sudy at least one foreign language; warmasium students, two languages.
