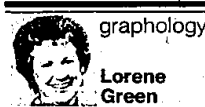


# Writer has need for approval

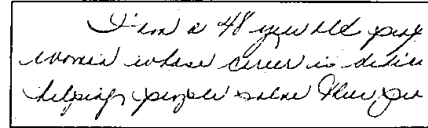
There may be a financial concern here. Money or numbers hold more
