
Night Watch' entertaining

Schoolcraft College's production of "Night Watch" is an entertaining melodramatic thriller. One might wish the student performers were more polished and experienced, but Director James Hartman's elegant setting and superb sound effects combine to capture the exence of Lucillie Fletcher's psycho-mystery. "Night Watch" poses a number of questions for the audience. What do you make of a woman who claims to see a man murdered in a window, yet the police can find no evidence of a body? Is she delusional? What is she claims to see another muder, only this time it's a young lady? Is



someone trying to drive her crazy? Could it be her husband who is hav-ing an affair with a friend? Or is it something else that will only become clear with a surprise ending?

SUSAN DURACK skillfully plays the woman in question. It's a difficult role because we must see (or think we see) what she claims to have witnessed. There are no bodies. No murder weapons. And indeed, few really good clues. The show depends on her creating that fine line between fear and madness — and the audlence trying to determine her true state of mind. For the most part, she does a fine job with an emotionally draining part.

Her task would have been somewhat easier if the supporting cast more experienced at creating mysterious characters and suspenseful moments. Speech inflections, slight pauses, and little looks would go a long way in helping Sean Sullivan (husband) and Stephanle Lockhart (best friend) achieve more natural characters. ral characters.

"GHASTLY, GRUESOME, Ghostly Tales" is a cassette tape full of creepy stories of poltergelsts and unexplained mysteries as told by Gundella, a well-known storyteller

howling Halloween gathering.
