The TWYKAA program has been used for several years in the southern United States, but is somewhat new to the Michigan area with the exception of Troy where the program is firmly entrenched.

The four, 2½-hour sessions held once each week offer some lecture material, but also give parents a chance to get involved through discussion groups, Newcombe said. It offers a different approach to alcohol education with the understanding that 92 percent of children are expected to experiment with alcohol by the time they reach their senior year in high school.

"It teaches you how to give infor

mation without giving them permis-sion to drink," she said. "You know, statistically, your child is going to experiment with alcobol. What you don't want, is for your child to be-come hurt while experimenting."

PREVENTION RESEARCH Insti-PREVENTION RESEARCH Institute of Kentucky — the company which designed the program — believe parents have the biggest influence on their children's lives. "The person we're alming at is a parent," Newcombe said. "It's not teachers or friends. The most effective person for delivering this information is the parent."


