Lord, a former member of the National Organization for Women, said she wasn't afraid Thomas would cast the deciding vote in overturning abortion rights.

"If we lose at the Supreme Court, we'll win at the bailot box," she said. "Acutally, I don't believe the public is as far apart on the Issue as our leaders would have us believe. I don't think there are many pro-thoice people who would favor abortions in the third tri-mester. One lidea I been considering is to cut welfare \$1 or the very \$2 they earn in the workforce."
