Harrison, which moves up to Class A bext year, is making its sixth straight playoff appearance — all in Class B — and its 11th overall since 1976. The Hawks have won four state champlouships, three in Class B and one in Class A.

"Any time two teams get together anything can happen. Our kids will be ready, but we are playing one of the best teams in the state and it will take a tremendous effort to pull it off."

Crestwood's last game helped its confidence when it upset unbeaten Dearborn Heights Robichaud 29-7.

"We were playing a rated team that had held teams to 21 points and no rushing touchdowns." Carter said. "To be able to run the ball on them, I think we made believers of some people."
