The first runner-up was Pula Singh of St. Valentines School in Redford and the second runner-up was Marc Vendrame from St. Mi-chael's School in Southfield.



The Michigan State Liquor Control Commission had asked the council to consider the license requests by Brinker International, which wants to build franchises of Chill's Bar and Grill and Romano's Macaroni Grill on 32749 Northwestern, south of 14 Mile Road, site of the former Paddock Pools.

The commission would grant the licenses, which require Brinker to invest at least \$1 million in each business, after investigating the completed restaurants.

Brinker expects to open both res-taurants by summer. Construction can begin after the city planning commission and engineers finish reviewing the restaurants after plans and landscape proposals and issue building permits.

Brinker applied for the special state licenses because the city has

already issued all of its liquor li-censes.

The city has issued 45 active li-The city has issued 45 active in-quor licenses to sell beer, when and liquor but may receive 3 or 4 more because of population increases based on the 1990 census, Kathryn Dornan, city cierk, said. She said cities are generally allowed to is-sue one liquor license for every 1,500 residents.
