## Learn Driving In A Classroom

**FARMINGTON**  
Students at Harrison High School in Farmington will now be able to drive a car down the highway without leaving the classroom.

This will be accomplished through use of driving simulators. The setup contains 16 simulators and a master recorder unit that measures student response to driving situations.

EBELING SAYS simulation training helps students identify and avoid situations of high accident potential and establishes basic car control skills needed for defensive driving.

"The situations in the film and the students' response to them also provide a springboard for classroom discussion. They offer the instructor a valuable teaching aid to increase his own communicating ability," Ebeling explains.
