

Trade Is Ecological

About 250 seedling trees for some 10,000 glass containers for recycling made a good trade, members of the Church of the Holy Spirit Episcopal Church in Westland decided after a day of collecting May 1.

The church had offered a seedling - blue spruce or autumn olive - for a bag of bottles to be taken to Livonia's glass collection center.

About 250 people came to the church, located at 34645 Cowan, to make the trade, and it took three trucks to cart off the bottles they brought.

THE REV. JACK SAVAGE, pastor of the church, said about 35 members participated, and there was enough interest shown by other churches in the area to indicate a follow-up effort in the fall, perhaps an ecumenical one.

"The ecological issue," Fr. Savage said of the church's project, "is one of the most important issues facing our society, and indeed the world, today."

"It's not the only pressing problem, to be sure, and we as Christians and as a society must not dwell solely on one issue to the exclusion of others."

"NEVERTHELESS, good ecological practices can and should begin at the individual and family levels. We as individual Christians cannot profess to love our Lord God without at the same time loving our neighbors and the creation in which He has placed us."

"So our project is an effort in a small way to serve the community in which we are located by bringing before it our concern for God's creation."

Evangelist To Visit CC Church

Dr. Holland B. London, internationally-known evangelist, will be the guest speaker May 12 to 16 in Community Baptist Church, 2827 W. Warren, Garden City. Services will be held each evening at 7:30. The pastor of the church is the Rev. James Allen.

Dr. London is a graduate of Bethany Nazarene College, Bethany, Okla., and has done graduate work at several universities.

He has made five recent world tours, and has preached in all 50 states as well as in England, Ireland, Africa, South and Central America, Mexico and India. At his recent campaign in Ghana, Africa, more than 40,000 were in attendance the last night of the campaign and more than 4,000 were baptized.

His most recent campaigns were in Jamaica and Haiti.

Famed Church Quartet Gets Strong Backing

Thanks to modern technology and materials, the Apostle Paul, John the Baptist, John Wycliff and John Wesley will be in residence in Farmington for many years to come.

The four gentlemen have been there since 1922 as part of a stained glass window in the front of the First United Methodist Church, Warner and Grand River.

But in recent years that irreplaceable window, given to the church by former Michigan Gov. Fred Warner, has been showing the effects of its age, looking occasionally, during storms and being threatened with general collapse.

SO THE CHURCH has put \$3,400 this week into a major renovation project that involves replacing the cement that holds the leaded panes and backing the whole thing

with a sheet of Lexan—a new Plexiglas-type product that will protect the window from the elements.

A restoration work is being done on the church's side and back windows. The side ones have smaller stained glass symbols and the back ones, though not decorative, are subject to snowball missiles during the winter and thus they too will get Lexan protection.

"We decided to use our Lenten collection for this purpose," said the Rev. Hugh White, senior minister, "because these windows are real treasures."

"Although the church's financial circumstances are somewhat strained, we feel we owe it to the community to keep them here—we'd be derelict in our duty if we let them fall into disrepair."

"It's always been part of the church's creed to serve the

community, and this is one thing we feel should be done."

The main window was given by the only state governor to come from Farmington as a memorial to his father and mother, P. Dean and Rhoda Warner.

THE COST OF the entire church, when it was built in 1922, was \$85,000. Today, Rev. White estimated, the windows alone would be valued at a figure of at least \$45,000, and "really could not be replaced."

The four figures in the central window were chosen as representatives of the pioneer phases of Christianity from the Methodist point of view.

Wesley was a pioneer of evangelical Christianity, John Wycliff a pioneer in the teaching of the English Bible, St. Paul a pioneer in Christian missions and John the Baptist a pioneer of Christianity.

Religion Update

"DROUGHT HITS THE HALLS OF DIVINITY" headlined the Protestant weekly The Christian Century, above an editorial contending that "Protestant seminaries are drying on the vine."

The inter-denominational magazine cited a number of causes for the crisis: economic recession, foundation shifts away from sectarian institutions, small numbers of alumni (few of whom, as clergymen, are highly paid and skyrocketing costs).

"The Century" also contended "Neither the Secular Man or Mr. Churchgoer has thought it necessary to take seriously the matter of educational credentials."

IN THIS particular category, however, the editorial could have included seminary administrators like Arnold Come of California.

Dr. Come is president of the Presbyterian Church's prestigious San Francisco Theological Seminary. He recently blasted, as what he termed "a completely phony issue," the San Francisco Examiner's report about one of its faculty members, the Rev. W. Haziah Williams.

The Rev. Dr. Williams spends most of his time as director of the Urban Black Center in Berkeley - which recently published a brochure stating that it is "able to grant credit." But consultation with both secular and theological accrediting agencies disclosed the fact that Williams' Center never itself been accredited and hence has no right to grant credit (for such courses as "Black Semester" - tuition, \$1,000).

President Come's angry rejoinder to The Examiner notably ignored the newspaper's additional disclosure that the no-credit standing of Williams had been "revoked and terminated" by the Congregational Church. This disciplinary measure - the equivalent of depositing unfrocking a clergyman -

took place as a result of Williams' methods in trying to oust his co-pastor of the South Berkeley Community Church, in 1967.

Williams was later appointed director of the Urban Black Center by Berkeley's famed Graduate Theological Union (GTU) a cooperative of nine Bay Area seminaries (which, however, recently separated itself from all the financial administrations of Williams' center.)

When Dr. John Dillenberger, president of GTU, was asked if there had been any indication of Williams' conduct as a clergyman, he replied to his appointment, he replied:

"When we hire somebody we don't check churches."

Dillenberger also confirmed reports that Director Williams had "requested" the nine seminaries to contribute \$15,000 apiece to his center. One seminary president (Unitarian) who refused was loudly denounced by Williams as a "necrotic." Only one of the nine seminaries came across with the \$15,000 - although the Episcopal Church Divinity School very cleverly awarded Williams an honorary doctorate.

WHILE WILLIAMS' salary has not been regarded as public information, there is no such modesty in the reports of this effect - as published by his center. One of these reports describes Williams as "renowned for his incisive and insightful analysis" and goes on to report that "The highlight of the meeting was the exciting presentation by the director, Haziah Williams." (The director's four assistants are mentioned in this 34-page report - in the appendix - while he is mentioned 32 times.)

Director Williams is also being retained on the Presbyterian Seminary faculty despite the impending termination of four faculty

members and two administrative officials - and widespread rumors of a whopping operating deficit, (which a spokesman for the seminary refused to confirm or deny).

But despite this situation and the departing faculty, the Presbyterian seminary has just appointed a new faculty member, the Rev. John R. Fry, of Chicago.

Witnesses before a U.S. Senate subcommittee testified that Rev. Fry had allowed his church in Chicago to be used as an arsenal for the notorious Blackstone Rangers street gang - who, they said, he had encouraged to engage in extortion and had conducted drug parties and had warned about impending police raids.

And while Chicago Presbyterian leaders have strongly denied these allegations, their denials would appear much more plausible to the general public had Rev. Fry not resigned his Chicago pulpit just one day before 23 of the Blackstone gang were indicted by a Federal grand jury - on charges of defrauding a federal training program for ghetto youth.
