

# Hartsock elected Farmington mayor

an account representative with Horace Mann Insurance and mother of two grown children, Kelly and Erin. McShane garnered 1,275 votes.

Both won four-year terms.

Arnold Campbell, elected mayor pro-tem, won third place with 1,096 votes and a two-year seat. Campbell was mayor pro-tem in the 1989 election when he was beat out by new-

comer McShane.

Campbell, a Ford Motor Company product problem analyst, views one of his roles as councilman to be a goodwill ambassador for the city. The most important part of city

government is not the council, Hartsock said during his campaign, but how residents interact with their city.

Currently a partner in the regional investment firm of Roney & Co. and an entrepreneur who has been involved in starting two companies during the past decade, Hartsock said he brings a good sense of business and finance to the city in a time of financial uncertainty due to state and federal cutbacks.

BEFORE STRIKING out on his own, Hartsock worked as a certified public accountant for eight years.

He's served on the city's planning commission, zoning board of appeals and will continue to chair the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission.

Campbell, married with two sons, Andrew and Bryan, has served on the Farmington Planning Commission, Zoning Board of Appeals, and the Economic Development Corporation. He was involved with a five-year library study and is involved with South Farmington Baseball, the Farmington Soccer Club and scouting. He also serves on Farmington's Founding Celebration Committee for its 125th birthday.

Ralph Yoder, a Farmington councilman for the last 26 years, was noticeably absent Monday. Yoder, a retired trucking company executive, who has also served as mayor, finished out of the running in the last election.

He was mayor pro-tem.
