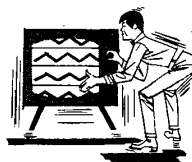

It looked like a dangerous maneuver somewhere in Southeast Asia. Some 150 men and support vehicles, properly briefed by their commanding officer, fanned out across the open field, watching carefully, concentrating on trouble spots scouted in advance by rangers.

It wasn't Vietnam, or another secret move into Laos. It was an undeclared war on litter in Detroit area parks, and the soldiers in action were members of the Army's Livonia-based 70th Division (Training) Support Battalion.

The men were under orders to "clear the area" of Huron Metro Park, in Brownstown Township, as part of a two-day "park action" cleanup sponsored through the Army's Detroit area community month.

The Livonia reservists went in on a voluntary basis with park rangers on the weekend cleaning maneuver.
