## McDonald Bill Aim: Ease Local Tax

WASHINGTON  
A congressional bill that would shift part of the cost of education from the property owner to the state has been sponsored by Congressman Jack J. McDonald (R-Farmington).  
The bill would give a federal bonus to states who assume part of the financial costs of education. Each state would

get a one-time 50 per cent rebate on the total support assumed.

"The property tax as a revenue source for primary and secondary education is regressive in that it is indiscriminately levied against people regardless of their ability to pay," McDonald said.

"At the present time 55 per cent of the cost of education is borne by local property owners," McDonald said.  
"This one-time effort on the part of the federal government will encourage state government to initiate or expand income taxes which are based on the ability to pay rather than the existing across-the-board property tax."

The bill was referred to the House Committee on Education and Labor.

A recent opinion from Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley said the state law requirement is no longer valid.

May 17 at 4 p.m. is the deadline for candidates to file for two posts on the Clarenceville school board. So far, no one has filed, and only one petition form has been picked up.
