In explaining why the report might be needed, Supt. Roderick J. Smith commented: "We have been aware that statements made in the community about the Family Life programs perhaps are confusing to some individuals concerning the activities of the board and its committees."

TRUSTEE Aldo Vagnozzi expanded on the superin-

tendent's remarks by stating that misrepresentations are being circulated about the FLE programs' intent.
