Hills man gets prison sentence

A 30-year-old Farmington Hills
man was sentenced Dec. 10 after
being convicted of being a felon in
speciession of a firearm, according to
the U.S. District Attorney's office.

When Farmington Hills police re-sponded, they found a loaded 9mm semiautomatic pistol in Hyder's pos-session, according to Chadwell.

At his prelimlary examination on state felonious assault charges, Hyder's wife testilied that he beat her to the ground, held the gun to her head and threatened to kill her. Hyder has since recanted her testimony, Chadwell said.

But Hyder was prosecuted by fed-

eral authorities for being a felon in possession of a firearm. Hyder has four prior felony convictions, includ-ing two for armed robbery, one for unarmed robbery and one for feloni-men assaults. ous assault.

Hyder's 70-month sentence is non-parolable under federal law, Chadwell said.

The case was investigated by the Farmington Hills police and the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.


