If any remain, buttons can be purchased on New Year's Eve for \$7 at the Community House until 3 p.m. and at City Hall all day and evening. Last year was a sell out. So buttons could be sold out before Dec. 31.

participating business and \$1 will be donated in your name to Cityscapes, a new program sponsored by the Cultural Council of Birmingham/Bloomfield, designed to bring art to public places. CCBB hopes to raise \$2,000 for Cityscapes with "Unbutton for Art."

Cityscapes will place works by prominent Michigan sculptors, beginning with Jay Leckowicz, Robert Seelok, James B. Clover, and Todd Erickson. Their sculptures will remain on view in various outdoor locations in town for six months to one year, after which others will be chosen and installed.

ART ON MAPLE: While you're walking between performing arts venues downtown, stroll across Maple to see visual arts displayed for your enjoyment.
