AVONDALE 76, CLARENCEVILLE 62: Five Livonia Clarenceville players scored in double figures, but it wasn't enough Friday as host Auburn Hills Avondale gained the Metro Conference victory.

Senior guard Dan Nunnery paced the Trojans and averaged with 17. Other Clarenceville players in double digits included John Kala (12), Mark Kala (11), Tony Malowski (10) and Mario Ivezaj (10).

Max Spangle tallied 16 for the victorious Yellowjackets, now 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the Metro.

"They put it to us in the third quarter," said Clarenceville coach Rob White, whose team was outscored 23-14 after trailing by only five at the half. "We started turning the ball over and we just didn't shoot well."

The Trojans were hurt at the outset of the second half when an apparent field goal was waved off because of offensive goaltending.

"They (the officials) said the ball was on the rim and Mario (Ivezaj) was called for a technical," White said. "It was a six-point swing."

REDFORD CC 72, U.D. JESUIT 67: Redford Catholic Central's one-two punch of Bob Kummer and Chad Varga combined for 43 points and 22 rebounds Friday in a Catholic League Central Division triumph at University of Detroit-Jesuit.

CC is now 6-1 overall and 2-0 in the Central.

Kummer, a 6-6 senior committed to UNC-Charlotte, tallied a team-high 24 points (on three 5-pointers) and 12 rebounds.

Varga, the 6-5 senior who has signed with Richmond, added 19 points and 10 boards.

Marc Gondek added 12 for the victorious Shamrocks, who led 29-17 after one quarter.
