• GRANT RECEIVED

The Farmington school system is funding a grant for \$10,000 to do the

initial stage of construction for an integrated communication system into Longacre Elementary school.

The state-of-the-art communication system will be similar to projects installed at Hillside and Gill elementary schools.

The grant was written by Longacre teachers and approved by the district's Technology Advisory committee, according to principal Bill Smithy. With the new system, each classroom will be tied to the media center, office and other classrooms and allow classrooms to receive and produce television, video recording, laser disc and audio productions.

A second grant approved by the committee authorizes purchase of touch windows for existing computers at Longacre.
