Blue-collar skaters ready for Games

Each Olympics has its darlings, those athletes so outstanding that they capture the imagination not only of their own countrymen, but the entire sports world. This week, when Olympic competition begins in earnest, the world will meet a U.S. figure-skating team with a story so American you can almost smell the apple pie.

Two years ago, almost no one had heard of Calla Urbanski and Rocco "Rocky" Marval, but their graceful, free-wheeling style is expected to impress the Olympic judges and delight viewers around the globe.

In an age where figure skaters, like tennis stars, are pampered and groomed for early stardom, Urbanski and Marval are an anomaly. Urbanski, who at age 31 is almost twice as old as many of her rivals, is a part-time cocktail waitress, and Marval is a

26-year-old trucking company owner. Both toiled in relative obscurity with a series of partners until they hooked up in 1990, then exploded onto the international scene by upsetting 1988 Olympic bronze medalists Natasha Kuchie and Todd Sand at Skate America in September of last year.

While there are those who feel that their blue-collar image could hurt the team's chances with traditional, conscious judges, Urbanski confidently predicts they will emerge as victors at the Games.
