'Roc' live should be anything but dull

For those who have ears to hear, PBS is expanding its Descriptive Video Service. Currently available on 58 affiliates, the service was pioneered by WGBH in Boston as a way of bringing the video portion of its television productions to the United States' 11 million blind and visually impaired audience members.

In Descriptive Video, a narrator's voice is added to the soundtrack to describe the action, much as in a radio play. The special audio track is selected by touching the Second Audio Program (SAP) button found on most late-model television sets. (This does not interfere with closed captioning, which currently requires the use of a special converter box.)

This season, Descriptive Video is available on the *Mystery*, *Degrassi*
