

Attorneys target 47th judge post

ant Wayne County prosecutor Marty Krohner.

Attorney Ric Knauer, who ran against district Judge Frederick Harris in the most recent judicial election in 1990, said he is leaning towards running again. Shirley Salzman, a general practice attorney, and another 47th District Court magistrate, Maria Parker, said they are also considering a candidacy but are awaiting news about the new seat.

At least one early endorsement in the race has been made. The Farmington units of the Police Officers Association of Michigan and Command Officers Association of Michigan — representing all the officers and commanders of that city's public safety department — have officially endorsed McDonald and Brady, said Farmington POAM president James Madigan.

IF TWO NON-PARTISAN judicial seats become available, candidates must circulate petitions and file for only one seat — they will not be considered for both, according to information from the Oakland County elections division and the Secretary of State elections division in Lansing, which handles district court judicial races.

If there are more than two candidates for either judicial seat, there will be a run-off in the Aug. 4 primary and the two top vote-getters for each seat will compete in the Nov. 3 general election.

Candidates for one or both seats must circulate petitions and file them with the state by May 12.

Definitely open this year will be the seat vacated by current district Judge Schaeffer at the end of December and only one candidate, McDonald, said he has definite plans to file for that seat. Other candidates said they would prefer to file for the new seat and not run against McDonald.

McDonald said he would be surprised if he were a sole candidate for the open seat. "I just can't believe that would be the case," he said. "Everybody has a right to do what they want to do. Competition keeps you on your toes."

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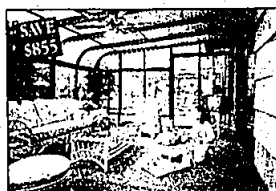
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
