
## westland: a community concerned with orderly development



That's the theme of our nationwide program to get older diesel engines to quit smoking.

Design improvements on newer Detroit Diesel engines have cut hydrocerbons by 90% and cerbon manazide by 40%, while reducing amoke by twothirds, to a point where it a practically invisible.

But we've also designed our dissals to last long so quite a few older ones are still at work. To solve this problem our 1,400 distributors and dealers from coast to coast are holding "Clean Air Clinics" to encourage owners to update and repair older engines.
