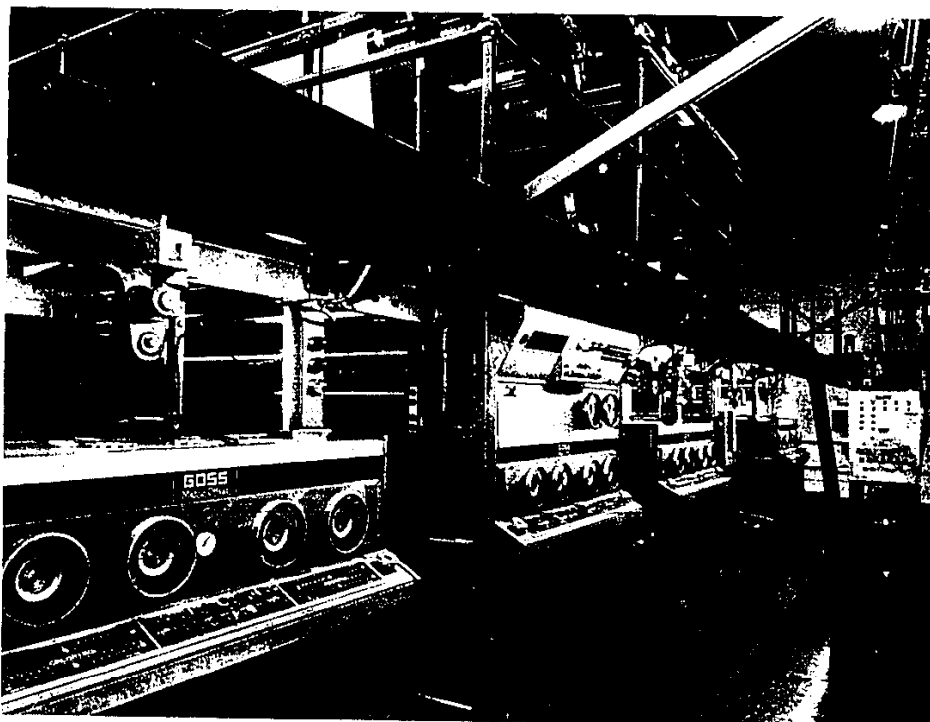
RECYCLING OF REFUSE — A program is
