

7th Patio King Search Is On

The seventh annual "King of the Patio" search will continue through May 31 for southeast Michigan men who appreciate and enjoy the art of outdoor cooking.

G. Sam Zilly, of Detroit Edison Co., contest sponsor, said it is open to men, 18 years of age and over, excepting professional cooks chefs, Edison employees and members of their families.

The contest for King of the Patio has, from its very first year, attracted hundreds of male contenders who submit their favorite recipes.

The grand prize is a complete patio ensemble, including an electric charcoal console and serving cart, patio dishes and stainless steel cutlery.

An electric rotisserie broiler with patio dishes and cutlery will be awarded as second prize, and the third prize will be an open hearth rotisserie broiler.

Seven other finalists who compete in a cookoff Thursday, June 10, also will receive electric appliances.

Entries must include name of contestant, address and telephone number; they should be mailed to Electric Living Division, The Detroit Edison Company, 2000 Second Avenue, Detroit, Michigan 48226.

Entries must be received at the Edison Electric Living office prior to the deadline, midnight, May 31.

Judges for the cook-off will be Len Barnes, Motor News outdoor editor, Mark Belaithe of the Detroit Free Press, and George Pierrot and Mort Neff, both of WWJ-TV. On the distaff side, and bringing to bear their long experience in cooking-contest judging, will be Cy Riley of the Detroit News, Kay Savage of the Detroit Free Press, and Edythe Fern Melrose, Lady of Charm.

Zilly solicited especially the men in his Detroit-Wayne area to enter the contest this year. "I like living in the area where Southeastern Michigan's best male cook resides. Chances are better, then, that I'll have occasion to sample his cooking again."

"Seriously," he continued, "I would very much like to see the winner, or at least one of the finalists, come from this Detroit-Wayne area. But, the area must have entries to have winners; the more entries, the better are our chances. I encourage all of our male culinary artists to send in their best recipes before May 31."
