

Eastern Plans Band Workshop

A band and orchestra workshop for high school students who wish to further their studies will be offered at Eastern Michigan University this summer.

The workshop, scheduled for June 20 through July 3, will include activities in band, orchestra and chamber ensemble. Recitals will be planned.

Band activities will be under the direction of Thomas Yra, associate professor of music, and director of the University Marching and Symphonic Bands.

Orchestra will be supervised by Edward Szabo,

associate professor of music and conductor of the Eastern Michigan Civic Symphony Orchestra.

Students in grades nine through 12 who are approved by their music directors are eligible to attend. They will live in Eastern's residence halls where all meals will be available cafeteria style.

A \$46 tuition fee covers all instructional costs. Room and board fees are \$64, making a total of \$110. A deposit of \$15 is payable with the application with the balance due by June 4.
