

2 Incumbents, 5 Challengers In C'ville

Seven persons have filed for two board of education seats in what is believed to be the largest field of candidates in Clarenceville history.

Among them are two incumbents. They are Thomas C. Wilson, 14-year veteran who is currently serving as board president, and Dr. Samuel Prisk, who has been a trustee for the past 12 years.

WILSON, 65, of 19317 St. Francis in the Livonia portion of the school district, is employed by Hydromation Filter Co. of Livonia. He and his wife, Jean, have three married children. The Wilsons have resided in the school district for 26 years.

Dr. Prisk, 49, lives at 30269 Gilman, also in the Livonia

sector. He and his wife, Janet, have three children: Jim, 23, who graduated from Central Michigan College last weekend; Loretta, 17, and Matthew, 12.

OCC Plans Science Institute

A summer science institute, sponsored under Oakland Community College's centers for excellence program, is being offered free of charge to all interested Oakland County high school juniors and seniors.

The program will be held at the Orchard Ridge Campus, 1696 and Orchard Lake Road, from June 23 through Aug. 18. It is designed to provide interested young science students with an opportunity to explore their physical world and, through guided experimentation, acquire tools for further investigation.

Experiments will be an integral part of the program. Audio-visual aids, demonstrations, discussions, and laboratory investigations will supplement lectures with tutorial assistance and the resources of Individualized Programmed Learning Laboratories also available. Classes will be held in the Orchard Ridge science building every Monday and Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The course, taught by full time faculty members of the OCC faculty will feature field trips to a variety of research laboratories and outside lectures.

The program is limited to the first 48 applicants. The only requirements for admission is successful completion of one course in high school algebra and an interest in science. While the course is free, students will be required to purchase a textbook (approximate cost \$9). Certificates of Completion will be awarded.
