CURRENTLY the Michigan Constitution forbids letteries and if the measure is passed by the voters, the State Legislature would have the authority to introduce a state statute allowing lotteries. Supporters of the lottery cited the amount of revenue it could bring into the state—a possible 5100 million per year—since the state is in financial difficulties. By the end of the fiscal year the state will have a deficit estimated at \$36 to \$50 million.


