

# Special eclipse may zap cable reception

Jonathan L. Kramer of Communications Support Corporation reminds us that cable television systems will be affected by outages caused by the sun. This interference will occur during the time period between March 1 and March 14.

"The worst interference to satellite-delivered TV channels will occur between March 6 and March 8," Jonathan said. Satellites orbit above the earth once every 24 hours as the earth spins on its axis every 24 hours.

"Twice a year, usually in March and October, a very special type of eclipse occurs. The sun passes behind the satellite relative to the fixed position of the satellite receiving antenna on earth." Volla... sun outages.

The occurrences may interfere for up to 30 minutes each day. The satellite picture will deteriorate in a variety of ways throughout this time.

Thank you to Jonathan Kramer for his ability to decipher the technical information into layman's talk. Now we'll know what it means when a sun outage is announced.

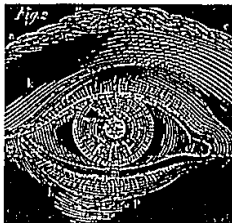
