This interference will occur during the time period between March 1 and March 14. "The worst interference to satel-lite-delivered TV channels will occur between March 6 and March 8," Jonathon said: Satellites orbit above the earth once every 24 hours as the earth as plan on its axis every 24 hours.

"Twice a year, usually in March and October, a very special type of cellipse occurs. The sun passes behind the satellite relative to the fixed position of the satellite receiving antenna on earth." Volla...sun

The occurrences may interfere for up to 30 minutes each day. The satellite picture will deteriorate in a variety of ways throughout this time.
