Rich McNamara served as best man with groomsmen Danny Beauregard,



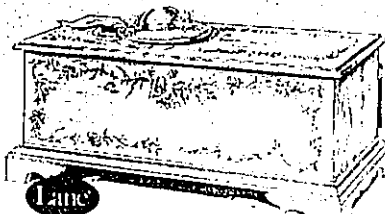
