Trash exporting ban threat worries solid waste officials

dilling and removal. Prior to the authority's formation, several of the cities had formed a solid waste consortium to study the pressing issue.

Landfill space in Oakland County is limited, and many communities like those in RRASOC contract with haulers who take garbage outside of Oakland to Westland and Wayne counties. The DNR has said it will require the county to include in its solid waste master plan facilities to handle solid waste over the next 20 years; to date, the county plan does not do that.

NOT ONLY IS there limited

landfill space, but recent plans to build an incinerator in the county fell through after the DNR refused to issue an air quality control permit.

Deadman said he hopes the state will take no drastic action, such as closing the borders.

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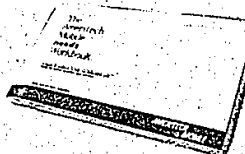
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
