**BASKETBALL NEWS**

Paul Gilvydis, a 6-foot-8 center from Farmington Hills Harrison, will attend Purdue University and play basketball as a preferred walk-on.

Gilvydis, a three-year varsity player, averaged 16 points, 10 rebounds and three blocks last season for the Hawks.

He had considered Harvard, Butler and some Mid-American Conference schools but chose Purdue where he plans to study engineering. Gilvydis has a 3.98 grade-point average and is a member of the Phi Beta Kappa honor society.

"He can get a great education there," Harrison coach Mike Teachman said. "I don't know what their plans are for him, but he won't play center at 6-8 in the Big Ten. He has good skill to play where he will play, however."

Gilvydis, who shot 49 percent from the floor and made 73 percent of his free throws, ranks fourth among Harrison's all-time leading scorers, third in rebounding and second in blocked shots.

**Chiefs eye 5th straight crown**

Fred Libbing is a first-year coach of the Plymouth-Canton boys tennis team, but his affiliation with the school sport began 35 years ago when he was captain of the Plymouth High team.

Libbing, who has been a counselor in the Plymouth-Canton district the last 31 years, replaces longtime coach Jim Hayes, who retired in January.

"I'm really happy about doing this," Libbing said. "This is something I've wanted to do. I helped Jim Hayes as much as I could in the past."

Despite losing all of its singles players to graduation, Canton remains a talented team, according to Libbing.

The Chiefs have won the Western Lakes Activities Association championship the last four years and finished third in the regional last season.

Senior Adam Majewski, who was a doubles player last season, fills the void left by Brian Schmidt at No. 1 singles.

"ADAM HAS consistently beaten everyone in challenge matches," Libbing said. "He's very skilled and very athletic."

Seniors Joe Binder and Stu Levenbach will occupy the Nos. 2 and 3 singles positions. Levenbach replaces senior Vipul Parikh, who is sidelined with a pulled muscle. Junior Jeff Fuerst will play No. 4 singles.

"It might take a while for these guys to get used to playing singles," Libbing said, restating the need to rebuild the lineup. "All of my singles players were doubles players last season."

"If I had to pick a strength on this team, it would be my doubles players. Of the five matches we've played so far this year, we haven't lost in doubles yet."

Senior Mike Donhouse and junior Steve Dale will play No. 1 doubles. Juniors Alex Warden and Eric Baden are slated to be the No. 2 team, and juniors Scott Roersma and Chris Bray will handle the No. 3 slot.

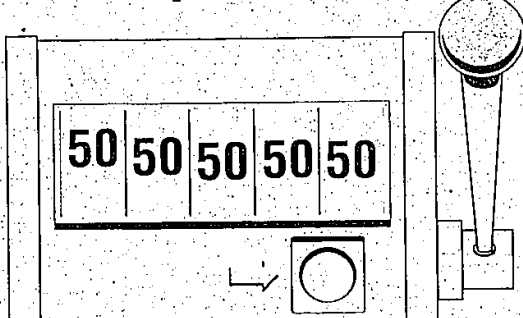
