Harrison girls 2-0 in division

Farmington Hills Harrison remained unbeaten in division dual meets Wednesday with a 22-38 victory over Northville in girls track.

The Hawks are 2-0 in the Western Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association. Harrison is 2-1 overall and the Mustangs 0-3.

"The weather wasn't great, the surface wasn't too good and the times were down, but when you win you have to be pleased," Harrison coach Mark Babcock said.

Colleen Heilmann won the long jump (15'4") and the 100-meter high hurdles (1:16) and was the only double individual winner for the Hawks.

Mechanic Henkela, Jessica Plett and Becky Sharpe had one individual win each and helped Harrison sweep first place in the relay.

Henkela won the 100 dash (47.7), Plett the 800 run (2:41.9) and Sharpe the 1,600 run (6:11.7).

Other winners for the Hawks were Misty Bjorkstal in the discus (55.9), Kristi

Corwell in the intermediate hurdles (2:29.9) and Sheri Slinnack in the 3,200 run (13:44).

Katie McAkin, Plett, Sharpe and Henkela comprised the 3,200 relay team that finished in 12:49. Henkela was the leadoff runner on the 1,600 unit that included Maggie Chavez, Becky Peans and Lori Hubble. The Hawks ran that race in 4:35.5.

Heather Conley, Susan Glowacki and Hubbe ran a leg of the 400 and 800 relay. Jessica Johnson anchored the 400 and Harrison had a 5:57 time; Krista Snow was the lead runner on the 800 team, which post a 1:56.2 time.

Harrison also won the Milan Relay for the third consecutive year on April 11. The Hawks were third or better in every event and scored 102 points. Milan was second (89) and Pinckney third (78).

ANNIE JUD AND Jenny Weh were double winners for the North Farmington girls Wednesday, but their efforts alone couldn't prevent host Westland John

Glenn from taking a 79-49 victory. The Raiders are 0-2 in the WLLA Lakes Division and the same overall. The Rockets are 1-1 and 2-1.

Jud won the 100 and 200 dashes with times of 13:52 and 28:64. Weh won the 800 run in 2:28.21 and the 1,600 run in 5:47.

North's only other individual first came in the 3,200 run in which Emily Salvey posted a 12:28.9 time.

The Raiders also grabbed first place in the 3,200 relay. Lisa Wantuck, Alicia Crossland, Rachel White and Weh combined to run the race in 11:31.98.

PLYMOUTH SALEM is unbeaten in dual meets after winning 93-35 over host Farmington on Wednesday.

The Hawks are 2-0 in the WLLA Lakes Division and 3-0 overall. It was the first defeat for the Falcons, who are 1-1 and 2-1, respectively.
