Detroit Symphony Orchestra concertmaster, Emmanuelle Bolser, will perform as a soloist 7:30 p.m. Sunday, April 26, at the Birmingham Temple, 26811 West 12 Mile Road in Farmington Hills.

She will be performing sonatas by Corelli and Beethoven and selections by Lalo and Kreisler. Pauline Martin will accompany her. Bolser is a member of the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra until her appointment as concertmaster of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in 1988. She has also made appearances at the Marlboro Music Festival, as well as in

major concert halls in the United States and Canada.

She is also a member of the St. Clair Trio, a Detroit-based ensemble performing recitals throughout the Midwest.

Bolser is on the faculty of Wayne State University and is a part-time member of the Center for Creative Studies.

She began her musical studies at age 3 at the Conservatoire de Musique at Quebec. Continuing at the Meadowmount School of Music and the Curtis Institute as a student of Ivan Galamian and David Serone, she graduated in 1984 with a bachelor's degree.

Russian conductor to lead symphony

The Southfield Symphony Orchestra, under the baton of Valery Leontov, guest conductor from Minsk, Byelorussia, will perform an all Tchaikovsky program 3 p.m. Sunday, May 3, at the Southfield High School Auditorium, 10 Mile and Lahser.

Leontov was the leading conductor of the Symphony Orchestra of the Ukraine Philharmonic Society in Voroshilovgrad. Presently, he is conductor of the National Symphony Orchestra of Byelorussian Radio and Television and conductor of the Byelorussian Opera and Ballet Theatre.

Vladislav Kovalsky, pianist, will perform Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto 1. Kovalsky came to the United States from the Soviet Union in 1980 and taught at the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music in Milwaukee.

He was the recipient of numerous awards before moving to the north Detroit area to teach at Wayne State University and the

University of Michigan.

In addition to performing with orchestras, Kovalsky has played recitals and chamber music. He performed in Japan in 1988 and 1989 and also in Korea where he conducted master classes in addition to performing.

Tickets are \$8, and \$5 for seniors and students. They can be purchased at the Mary Thompson Cultural Center, 25630 Evergreen, Southfield, or at the box office the day of the performance.
