the already ailing situation. "The snow just pushed it," Marinucci said.

Work on the roof has been under way for a couple weeks. "They tore off the whole roof and are putting a new one on," Marinucci said. A crane was brought in to lift the

roof off in pieces. The exterior roof over the office part of the headquarters is complete. Interior work, such as ceiling tiles, remains to be finished.

The roof over the apparatus bay is now being worked on. "There are breaks in those trusses too. But it hasn't been as severe. They aren't as broken as the others were," Marinucci said.

No fire retardant is being used in the new trusses. The building will have a sprinkling system.
