Under the toughened ordinance weeds and grass cannot exceed eight inches in height. It was six inches in the former ordinance. Exceptions to the ordinance will be made for exotic vegetation that is part of landscaping or for areas designated for renaturalization.

"The new ordinance was revised in fairness to subdivisions with less than 60 percent occupancy," said Dale Countegan, planning and com-

munity development director. "Lots werent being maintained and we couldn't do anything about it. Now, we can respond equally to people's complaints about overgrown weeds without regard to the percentage of lots occupied in a particular subdivision."
