CITY OF FARMINGTON
COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
(Summary)
A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Pro-Tem Campbell at 8:00 p.m. on April 20, 1992, in Council Chambers, 23500 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 287-1976.
PRESENT: Campbell, McShane, Richardson, Tupper.
ABSENT: Harstock.
OTIUS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Goss, Assistant Director, Goodman, Asst. Assistant Schultz, City Clerk Busby.
Minutes of the previous meeting of April 6, 1992, were approved as written. Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council adopted a resolution objecting to the rezoning of a parcel in the City of Farmington Hills at Drake Road and Grand River Avenue.
Council approved the requested outside seating at the Hollywood Grille, stipulating that trash receptacles be used and the area kept clean.
Council approved use of a cold air ballroom at Kensington Manor Apartments on April 24 through April 26, 1992.
Council tabled the requested sign variance for Books About to allow more study on placing signs on the Civic Theatre building.
Council approved the Downtown Farmington Business Association's request for sidewalk sales during the DDA summer fun program.
Council received and filed the DDA Annual Report.
Council authorized the following:
- Payment of \$244,932.77 to Proven Construction and \$27,518.14 to Black and Veatch for work completed on the Sewer Improvement Project.
- Participation in State road salt bid process for 1992-93.
- Reapproving Drake and Freedom Road Improvements for 1992-93 and adopting bonding resolutions authorizing sale of \$300,000.00 in Act 51 Highway Revenue Bonds.
Council set study sessions on the 1992-93 budget for May 7 and May 11, and established a public hearing on May 18, 1992, at 8:00 p.m.
Public comments and Council comments and announcements were heard.
Council received and filed the Department of Public Works, Water and Sewer Department and Building Department Quarterly Reports for January - March, 1992.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
