

Muskie Listening To Pulse Of Area

"I'm here to raise money for the Democratic Party tonight, but in view of some of the things I'm thinking about, maybe I should come back again," quipped unannounced Democratic presidential candidate Edmund S. Muskie (D-Maine) at the start of a fund-raiser held Monday night in Farmington Township.

More than 175 persons paid \$125 each to attend the cocktail gathering, held at the Farmington Fairway home of Philip Warren.

The suburban gathering represented Sen. Muskie's last stop in a full day campaign swing in the metropolitan area which included an address to the Detroit Economic Club and talks with state Democratic leaders.

INTRODUCED BY Sen. Philip A. Hart (D-Mich.), who made his support for Muskie clear if not explicit, Muskie paid tribute to Michigan Democrats, who he characterized as "liberal, politically active, and thoroughly issue-oriented."

"I've been spending the past months trying to get a sense of what the American people are thinking about," the tall Maine senator said, "and I've been trying to put myself into situations where I have to face people who might well be hostile to me or my views. It's been an interesting experience."

Answering questions, Muskie said that if he were

president, he would immediately start negotiations with the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese on the subject of American troop withdrawal from Vietnam. "We should not keep our troops there to prop up the Thieu-Ky regime. The Vietnamese have to work out the political problems of their own future in their own way," Muskie added.

He also called for a return to the "kind of values of cooperation, listening and respect for the other fellow's views" which he felt were a basic part of the American political tradition but had declined in recent years.

UNDER THE aegis of honorary chairman and former Democratic nominee for governor, Sander Levin, the gathering brought together a cross-section of top Michigan Democrats and a sprinkling of independents anxious to evaluate Muskie as a presidential contender.

Crowd reaction was generally favorable, with one man remarking, "There goes

a Democratic Abe Lincoln," though some felt Muskie could have been more explicit in his statement on Vietnam.

Host Warren remarked, "He's a very impressive guy; cool, and a real professional." Heading a large group from Southfield was Mrs. Sandra Silver. Other Southfield residents attending were: Dr. John Cohen; Milton and Joe Dressner; Mr. and Mrs. Merrill Gordon; Philip Kanter; Dr. and Mrs. Frank Middleman; Mr. and Mrs. Howard Rosenberg; Edwin Rubenstein; Dr. Roy Stoller. Livonia's Mayor Edward McNamara, former Democratic lieutenant governor candidate, represented Wayne County, while others from Farmington joined the Warrens. Included were: Robert Fezzy; Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Maisel; Mr. and Mrs. Meyer Stern; and Mr. and Mrs. Walter Wolpin.

As one man left, he looked around at the Warren's lovely home and remarked, "Man, the \$125 is worth it just to look at the house alone."
